Fulbright Contact

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Important to note

Applicants for Fulbright NZ Graduate Awards should follow these instructions to ensure applications are accurate and complete. Note: Applicants may only apply for one award per application cycle.

The online application system is used by all Fulbright offices worldwide. As such, some of the questions and instructions in the application do not pertain to New Zealand applicants. **NZ applicants should follow this instruction document carefully** to ensure they meet all country-specific requirements.

Applications that are submitted late, or that are incomplete after the 1 August deadline will not be considered for these awards. Note that this includes the 3 required references.

Key Documents

In addition to the standard format information required in the online application, you are required to upload key documents. Please ensure these are included and in the correct format. **Key documents:**

- Study/Research Objective 1 page (check format requirements in relevant section).
- Personal Statement . 1 page (check format requirements in relevant section).
- Ngā Pae o te Māramatanga Statement (if relevant) 1 page (check format).
- Country Specific Questions Form download the template and ensure you upload as a PDF scan.
- Transcripts upload in application AND send official documents to Fulbright NZ by deadline.
- Recommendations 3 (and 3 only) are required, and must be received by the application deadline.

Notifications

You may receive emails from Fulbright NZ and/or the application system throughout the application and selection process. It is important to read these messages and follow any instructions promptly.

Application Checklist

Ensure all tasks are completed, your application is submitted, and official transcripts are received at Fulbright NZ before the 1 August deadline. Late or incomplete applications will not be considered for these awards.

Ensure you understand and fully comply with all the eligibility requirements
Contact and confirm your referees, notify them of the process and 1 August deadline
Order official transcripts for all qualifications to be sent direct from awarding uni to Fulbright NZ
Complete all required/relevant questions in online application form
Complete spelling and grammar check across entire application
Upload PDF scan of transcripts and diplomas (official or non-official) for all degrees
Upload PDF scan of completed country specific questions form to online application
Submit completed application by 1 August

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General Information

The application is supported by all modern browsers. We highly recommend that you use a current version of <u>Google Chrome</u>, which supports Windows, Mac, and Linux platforms.

Step 1: Make sure you are eligible

Before you begin an application, check you meet the eligibility requirements.

To be eligible, you must:

- have achieved 480 points, which must include a completed undergraduate degree
- not yet hold a doctoral degree
- plan to undertake full-time postgraduate study or research at a US institution for a period of at least six months; and
- meet the citizenship requirements for this award.

Fulbright New Zealand will also accept applications from candidates who were granted direct entry into the second year of a degree programme, therefore completing a 480-point degree with 360 points. In exceptional circumstances, Fulbright New Zealand may consider the application of a student with a 360-point degree provided they have both the strong support of their tertiary institution (from a Dean or member of senior management) and a conditional offer from a US institution.

Preference for Fulbright graduate awards is given to candidates who have not previously received a Fulbright graduate award or had extensive recent experience in the US (i.e. have not studied, taught, researched, or worked in the US for a period aggregating more than 9 months/1 academic year during the past 5 years).

Candidates may not pursue study or research activities that involve direct clinical patient contact. This can extend to the fields of Medical Sciences, Veterinary Medicine, Nursing, Dentistry, Psychological Counselling or any other field that requires direct clinical patient contact and/or prescribing or administering medication. Candidates with medical degrees may receive awards for advanced academic study, but not for internships or residencies. Awards shall not authorise activity for which a license to practice medicine or nursing is required.

Step 2: Record username and password in a safe place

Your email address is your username. When you create an account for this online application, record your password in a secure place. You can log in and out of the application as frequently as you like using your username and password. If necessary, you can reset your password by clicking the "Forgot Your Password" link on the log-in page.

Step 3: Complete the application

You do not need to complete this application at one time. You can re-enter at any time to edit your application. However, once you SUBMIT your application, you CANNOT make changes to it.

To complete your application correctly, please answer all questions completely and carefully. Review these additional tips:

- Use upper and lower-case letters (e.g. John Smith). Avoid using all capital letters (e.g. JOHN SMITH).
 Do not use special characters, such as accent marks.
- You can copy and paste information into all text boxes.
- Limit your responses to the space provided in all text boxes.
- Prepare required documents and save them in PDF format. It is highly recommended that to preserve any formatting and special characters in your documents, you upload them in PDF format.
- Some questions are "required." They are marked with an asterisk (*). You will not be able to submit your application until all required items are complete.

Step 4: Submit the application

Once you have entered all required information, including recommenders, review your application for errors. If all information is correct, submit your application. Once you submit you CANNOT make changes to your application.

Creating Your Online Account


- 1. To start, follow this link and click Create an account.
- 2. Enter your email address, first name, last name, and select your date of birth (Month-Day-Year, American format) from the drop-down menus. Your name must be entered exactly the way it appears (or will appear) on your passport.



Note: Use an email address that you will be able to access for at least two years after submitting your application. This is the email address you will use to log in to your application account. We recommend you do NOT use a work or university email address if you will not have access to it during your grant in the US.

3. Click Continue. You will receive an email from apply@iie.org confirming that you have started the application. The email will include a temporary PIN. Follow the instructions in the email to activate your account using the temporary PIN.

You will be prompted to enter your pin and then create a password to complete login.



4. Returning users: Click *Log in* and enter your email address and password. If you do not remember your password, click *Forgot your password?* and follow the resulting instructions.

Managing Your Application

Editing your application prior to submission

- 1. You may log in at any time to review and edit your application form, upload documents, and enter recommender information.
- 2. Remember to save your application after completing each page by pressing the <u>Continue</u> button at the bottom of each page.

Note: The application will automatically log you out after 60 minutes of inactivity, so it is best to save your application frequently.

Reviewing your application after submission

- 1. After you SUBMIT your application, you CANNOT make any changes.
- 2. You may continue to log in to your account to view the information you have submitted, save a PDF of your application form, and manage your recommenders.
- 3. Manage your recommenders by clicking on the *Recommendations* section of the application.

Letters of recommendation

- 1. Letters of recommendation will be submitted directly to Fulbright by the recommenders you registered via your application.
- 2. Letters of recommendation may be submitted before or after you submit the application, **but they must be completed by the 1 August deadline.**
- 3. If your recommender is unavailable, you will have the option to exclude the recommender and add an alternative, even after you submit the application.

Welcome

Once you have created your account you will be taken to a Welcome page. The Fulbright Policy Guidelines (FFSB policies) are linked from this page. Chapter 500 "Students from Partner Countries" relates to the NZ Graduate awards. Confirm you have read by ticking the box. You will then be able to progress.

Preliminary Questions

These questions address essential program eligibility. All questions are required.

- 1. Select the **country** through which you are applying from the dropdown menu.
- 2. Select the appropriate program year from the dropdown menu. It should be 2025-2026.
- 3. US **Citizenship**, Dual Citizenship with the US or Permanent Residency: select 'yes' or 'no' to indicate your response. Note that applicants cannot be US citizens or permanent residents of the US to participate in the Fulbright Foreign Student Program.
- 4. Select 'yes', 'no', or 'unsure' to indicate if you are aware and meet all program **eligibility** requirements. Please review the program eligibility requirements provided at the beginning of this document.
- 5. Select 'yes' or 'no' to agree to IIE's **Data Privacy** terms to consent to their processing your data. Note you will have to agree to proceed with the application.
- 6. **Employment** Eligibility read this carefully and select 'yes' or 'no'.
- 7. **Reference Materials Waiver** select 'yes' or 'no' to indicate whether you waive your right to review the information contained in the evaluations submitted by recommenders on your behalf. Please note, Fulbright NZ will not release any recommendations to candidates without the referee's verified permission.
- 8. Click *Continue* to save your responses and advance to the next section.

PLEASE NOTE: Some Fulbright commissions require candidates to contact them before beginning an application. Fulbright NZ does **NOT** require this. You need only contact us if you have questions or concerns.

Country Information

- 1. Review all information in this section carefully. Note the current application cycle and deadline.
- 2. You must select a specific award before proceeding. Select either; General, Science and Innovation, or Fulbright-Ngā Pae o te Māramatanga.

Supplemental Forms

- 3. Download and complete the 'NZ Supplemental Form/Country Specific Questions' form available in this section. You must upload a PDF of the completed form next to the heading 'Country-Specific Materials' in the 'Additional Information' section of the application. This is the only supplemental form you are required to complete.
- 4. New Zealand candidates are **NOT** required to complete the following documents: **Information** Concerning Foreign Student Academic Records, Transcript Release Form, Report on Proficiency in English, Writing Sample.
- 5. Click Continue to save your responses and advance to the next section.

Personal Information

Enter all required biographical information.

- 1. Enter your name exactly as it appears on your passport. Only enter a preferred name if it is DIFFERENT than your legal name (e.g. Alex instead of Alexander).
- 2. If your name is recorded differently on any previous records (e.g. transcripts), list it in the Name on Previous Records section.
- 3. The birthdate that you used to create your account will automatically appear. If you entered this date incorrectly during your account creation, you may correct it now. (Format: Month/Day/Year)
- 4. Enter your city of birth and select country of birth, sex (as it appears or will appear on your passport or travel document), preferred gender identity, and marital status from the dropdown

- menus provided.
- 5. List any form of limitation that may require accommodation. This information is gathered for use by the placement team in ensuring appropriate accommodation is sought at potential host unis.
- 6. Select your country of citizenship and country of residence from the dropdown menus provided.
- 7. If applicable, enter your national identification number and any additional countries in which you hold citizenship. To select multiple countries, hold down the CTRL (PC) or Command (Mac) button when selecting options.
- 8. Click *Continue* to save your responses and advance to the next section.

Contact Information

Enter all required contact information.

- 1. Select the country where you live from the dropdown list first when entering your permanent address (i.e. physical address where you live).
 - a. Based on your country selection, the subsequent fields will change to match the address format of that country.
 - b. Complete the remaining address fields. Do not use accents or special characters.
- 2. Select 'yes' or 'no' to indicate if your current mailing address (i.e. the address where you receive mail) is the same as the permanent address you entered above. They do not have to be the same.
 - a. If you answer 'no,' then a second address section will appear where you may enter your mailing address information.
 - b. If you answer 'yes' to this question, proceed immediately to the next question.
- 3. Enter your contact numbers as appropriate. Include the country code (+64 for NZ). If the field turns red, please review the numbers that you have entered to look for any errors.
- 4. The email address used to create your account will appear in the primary email address field and will not be editable. You may provide an Alternate/Secondary Email that can be used to contact you if Fulbright Program Officers cannot reach you via your primary email address.
 - Note: All system-generated emails will continue to go to your primary email address.
- 5. Providing an emergency contact for New Zealand is required. If you would like to provide emergency contact for the US, please also enter the appropriate information. The individuals you list may be contacted in the event of an emergency while you are participating in grant activities, including any required travel for interviews in your home country.
 - a. When entering the address, choose the country that corresponds to your emergency contacts' address first and the following fields will update to match the address format of the selected country.

6. Click *Continue* to save your responses and advance to the next section.

Academic & Professional Information

This section collects information about your academic and professional background, including your curriculum vitae/resumé, academic degrees, professional experience, awards and recognitions, and experience abroad.

Prepare and upload documents in PDF format as required (* indicates a required field). Note any page limits and ensure your documents do not exceed page limits.

Curriculum Vitae/Resumé

1. Upload your curriculum vitae/resumé in PDF format that does not exceed four (4) pages. Note: If your file exceeds 4 pages, an error message will appear on the Review page and will prevent submission of your Please upload a document that does not exceed four Curriculum Choose File No file chosen application.



- a. Click Choose File
- b. Locate and select the file that you previously saved to your computer

Upload

Academic Background

- 2. List all post-secondary tertiary educational institutions from which you have received a degree or academic credential (credit-bearing coursework) e.g. universities or institutes of technology and polytechnics. Enter these in reverse chronological order, including any in which you might be presently enrolled. Do not include any short-term certificate programs. You MUST include any education institutions you are currently attending (even if you have not yet completed your educational program) and estimated date of graduation/completion.
 - a. Click Add New Academic Background
 - b. Type in the name of the institution
 - c. Choose the level of study (graduate or undergraduate) from the dropdown menu. Note: in the US the term 'graduate' means the same as 'post-graduate' in NZ
 - d. Select the country where the institution is located from the dropdown menu
 - e. Enter the appropriate city and region/state
 - f. Provide the website of the institution (this is optional)
 - g. Degree codes provided reflect the US university system. Select the US equivalent of the degree or diploma earned (e.g., BA Bachelor of Arts, BS Bachelor of Science). A quick google search will help you find the US equivalent code for your degrees. If an equivalent degree code is not listed, select "Baccalaurate, Other"
 - h. Enter the discipline in which this degree or diploma was earned
 - i. Provide the actual name of the degree or diploma in full
 - j. Enter your GPA for this degree and the maximum possible GPA you could get. If you are unable to source this information, enter "NA" (this is a required field)
 - k. Select the month and year of start and end dates (Month Year format) that you attended this institution. If a degree is in progress, list expected end date of academic program
 - I. Select the date (Month-Year format) that you received your degree from this institution. If a degree is in progress, list expected date of conferral in this field
 - m. Click Save.



3. To add additional entries for post-secondary tertiary educational institutions, click *Add New Academic Background* and follow the bulleted instructions above for every degree you have earned, or are currently undertaking. **NOTE:** When adding a second degree program from an institution that has already been entered, add Degree 2, Degree 3, etc. into the Institution Field (as shown above – underlined in green) and click save. This ensures that the original degree from that institution will not be overwritten.

Professional Experience

- 4. List your current professional affiliation or employer by clicking *Add New Professional Experience* under Position Title.
 - a. Choose the role which most closely corresponds to your current role and/or relevant previous professional work experience from the drop-down menu
 - b. Enter position title (e.g. Director, Assistant Director, etc.) or type of work (e.g. accounting)
 - c. Enter the name of your employer
 - d. Select the start and end dates for the position you entered (Month-Year format). If you are currently employed in this role, leave the End Date fields blank
 - e. Select the country where your current place of employment is located from the dropdown menu. Enter in the street address, city, state/region, and post code as applicable
 - f. Click Save
- 5. If you have more than one **relevant** position, click *Add New Professional Experience* and follow the instructions above. Enter chronologically from current/most recent working backwards.

Awards and Recognitions

- 6. Enter a list of the following items into the text boxes provided (all text boxes have a 250-word limit). If you do not have anything to add, leave text boxes blank:
 - a. Any scholarships and/or fellowships you currently or previously received (include the source or sponsor, amount, where held and duration)
 - b. Any academic honours and prizes that you have received (include any titles and/or dates)
 - c. Any books, articles, and/or thesis published by you, particularly in your proposed field of study (include the title, place, and date of publication)
 - d. Any teaching experience (current or previous positions); this is especially relevant for PhD candidates and candidates in the field of education
 - e. Any research you have completed or in which you are currently involved
 - f. Any memberships in professional organizations, or licensing obtained by a professional organization

Experience Abroad

- 7. List any travel, study or residency you have had abroad (in any country other than your own) **for more than one month**. This can include time overseas for education, research, business, vacation, etc.
 - a. Click Add New Experience Abroad
 - b. Select the country in which you spent your travel and/or residence abroad from the dropdown menu provided
 - c. Select the start and end dates (Month-Year format) of your travel/residency
 - d. Enter the purpose of your travel abroad
 - e. Click Save
- 8. If you have had multiple trips abroad more than one month in duration click *Add New Experience Abroad* again, and follow the bulleted instructions until all entries have been saved.
- 9. Select 'yes' or 'no' to indicate if you have previously entered the United States on a J-1 or J-2 visa.
 - a. If 'yes', you are required to select the J category of sponsorship from the list and upload a copy of your previous DS-2019
- 10. Select 'yes' or 'no' to indicate if you have previously been awarded a Fulbright grant.
 - a. If 'yes', you are required to list the grant(s) and provide details
- 11. Click *Continue* to save your responses and advance to the next section.

Academic Materials

This section collects copies of your transcripts and/or diplomas. A diploma is the US term for the certificate of completion or degree award. Upload scans of all available transcripts and diplomas from post-secondary tertiary institutions you have attended. Copies of transcripts/diplomas are required for application to U.S. host institutions.

The files you upload to your online application can either be official e-Qual transcripts, copies/scans of official transcripts, or unofficial transcripts. However, you must also arrange for <u>official</u>, verified transcripts to be sent to Fulbright NZ for all your tertiary academic degrees (See note below).



US diploma / NZ certificate of completion

In the online application:

- 1. Select the corresponding institution from the list of institutions you previously entered.
- 2. Review the institution information (which you provided on the previous page). If this information is incorrect, you can edit the information directly in the popup box.
 - a. If you do not see an institution in the list that you attended, you may either return to the Academic & Professional Information page and update your academic background or add the institution directly in this section by clicking the "Add Institution" link.
- 3. Select *Choose File* and locate the desired file on your computer. Click *Open*. You may upload transcripts/diplomas as multi-page documents or upload single page documents. PDF, JPEG, and TIFF image files are all accepted.
- 4. Click Save. Repeat these steps for all applicable institutions.
- 5. Click Continue to save your responses and advance to the next section.

IMPORTANT: Official transcripts are also required

• You must also arrange for official transcripts to be **sent directly** to Fulbright NZ from the awarding university, either as e-Qual or hard copies. We must receive all official transcripts by the application deadline 1 August. **This requirement is non-negotiable**. (e-Qual or hard copy)

My e-Qual Transcripts: Most NZ universities now use the My e-Qual platform to send official, verified digital transcripts. We prefer that you use this method, if possible. Digital transcripts must be emailed directly to scholarships2@fulbright.org.nz via the e-Qual system. Do not use an access PIN. These must be received by the deadline 1 August.

Hard Copy Transcripts:

If your university does not use e-Quals, you must arrange for hard copy official transcripts to be sent. This may be the case for some overseas qualifications, some Wananga and NZ other tertiary institutions. **Transcripts can take time to be delivered so ensure you complete this task with plenty of time to spare, as they need to be received by Fulbright NZ by the application deadline 1 August.** For hard copies please Courier to: Level 5, 26 The Terrace, Wellington 6011, Postal: PO Box 3465, Wellington 6140. Note hard copy transcripts may be unable to be returned to you.

Language Skills

This section collects information about your native language, English language skills, and any additional languages that are relevant to your project proposal.

Native Language Skills

Select your native language from the dropdown menu provided.

English Language Proficiency

If English is not your native language, a section re your English language proficiency will appear. Rate your English language proficiency in Reading, Writing, and Speaking. Select Native, Advanced, Intermediate, Beginner or No Ability from the dropdown menus as appropriate.

Additional Language Skills

- a) Select the number of additional languages that you would like to include that may be of use for your project or study plans. **Note**: Te Reo is listed as 'Māori' in this list.
- b) Select the language you are reporting from the dropdown menu and rate your proficiency in Reading, Writing, and Speaking. Select Native, Advanced, Intermediate, Beginner or No Ability from the dropdown menus as appropriate.
- c) Click Continue to save your responses and advance to the next section.

Test Scores

This section collects information about standardized test scores that you have taken or will take in the future. Standardized tests include TOEFL, Duolingo, GRE, GMAT, IELTS, MCAT and LSAT. Standardized test scores are required for admission to U.S. institutions. You are <u>not required to have completed any standardized tests in order to apply for a Fulbright award</u>. However, we advise you to be informed and plan ahead for any standardized tests you may need to take in order to complete your proposed US programme (most commonly the GRE).

- 1. Select Add Test.
- 2. Select the test type from the dropdown menu.
- 3. Select the test date from the dropdown menu (Month-Day-Year format). If you have not yet taken the test, enter the date that you are registered for the test.
- 4. Enter your test scores, if you have the results from the test.
- 5. Click Save. Repeat these steps for all applicable standardized tests.
- 6. Click *Continue* to save your responses and advance to the next section.
- 7. If you enter test scores, you will be redirected to the Score Reports section, where you will upload copies of your available score reports.

Plagarism

Plagiarism Agreement

Read the information provided and select 'yes' to indicate your agreement. If you do not select yes you will be unable to submit your application. Click *Continue* to save and advance.

Study Plan

This section collects information about your proposed plan of study in the US.

1. Select the degree objective to which you are applying (see note below).

Important to note:

If you are applying to undertake research in the US as part of/towards an NZ-based research Masters or PhD programme, you must select the Visiting Student Researcher (VSR) objective. DO NOT select the objective that matches your NZ-based degree.

- 2. Select the most appropriate major academic discipline/field of study and primary specialization from the dropdown menus. Choose the field of study and specialization that is closest to your intended study in the US. Use the description box to clarify your discipline and specialization.
 - a. Some fields will trigger a prompt to ask you if you'd like to upload portfolio materials as part of your application. Select 'yes' or 'no'. If you select 'yes,' you will be directed to upload your materials on the next page. Please follow the upload instructions listed.
- 3. Enter a brief description of the field in which you plan to specialize in the US in the text box.
- 4. Enter a brief description of your future plans in the text box.

Intended Grant Period

5. Enter your proposed length of stay in the US and select your proposed date of arrival in the US (Month-Day-Year format) from the dropdown menu. Typically, degree-seeking students will begin in August/September of the proposed academic year. VSRs must be between 6-12 months, and may not commence before 1 August. These details are indicative only at application.

Study/Research Objective

- 6. Upload a copy of your study/research objective. Please write a clear and detailed description of your study/research objectives and provide your reasons for wanting to pursue them. This statement is an essential part of your application and is required. Do NOT mention specific US universities at which you would like to study.
 - a. Click Choose File
 - b. Locate and select the file that you previously saved to your computer
 - c. Click Open
 - d. Click Upload to complete the file upload

Important to note:

- This essay should be one A4 page, typed, font size 11, and uploaded in PFD format. DO NOT exceed the one page limit, or your application may not be accepted.
- You should take great care to write a clear and detailed description of the program you wish to pursue.
- Clearly identify the area/s within your field of study in which you plan to specialize or concentrate. If there is specific research that you want to accomplish, include a description.
- It is important to present your ideas and objectives in a clear and organized manner.
- Make sure to address why and how your objective aligns with the goals of the award you are applying for.
- Incomplete or overly brief statements may not provide the selection committee with enough information to assess your application.

Personal Statement

- 7. Upload a copy of your personal statement. **This is a required document**. Your personal statement should be a narrative statement providing insight to the Selection Committee about you as an individual; your ideals, personal background and motivations. Do NOT mention specific US universities at which you would like to study.
 - e. Click Choose File
 - f. Locate and select the file that you previously saved to your computer
 - g. Click Open
 - h. Click Upload to complete the file upload

Important to note:

- This essay should be one A4 page, typed, font size 11, and uploaded in PFD format. DO NOT exceed the one page limit, or your application may not be accepted.
- This is an opportunity for you to demonstrate the personal characteristics you feel are important to emphasise to the selection panel.
- Your personal statement should not be a re-working of your study/research objective nor should it include your resumé.
- You may include details about your education, experience, interests, career plans, and your motivation for applying for study in the US within the personal statement.
- This statement should address how you, and your future plans, align with the goals of the award you are applying for.

Writing Sample

8. A Writing Sample is **not required** for New Zealand applicants. The application system requires that you upload something in this section to proceed/submit. **You can simply upload a blank page as a PDF.**

Proposed US Institution

9. **Applicable only** to applicants who have already been offered admission to a US University and plan to attend that university. Upload the letter of invitation/admission from the US institution. **NOTE:** This is NOT a requirement as **you do not need to have applied and been admitted to universities at the**

time of application. If selected, you will have the chance to use the IIE placement service to assist with university applications.

University Preferences

10. List up to four institutions at which you would like to study in the US in priority order. Include specific departments and/or programs and provide specific reasons for your choice. If you have been in contact with professors, please provide names and email and/or phone contacts for each one. Note: this will inform placement advisors of your wishes but will not necessarily determine the final list of universities IIE/Fulbright help you apply to. I.e. it is not set in stone.

Applied US Institutions

*If you have previously applied to a U.S. Institution, or plan to apply to a U.S. institution yourself, please complete this section. Otherwise, move to the Authorization of Release of Information.

Note: It is NOT required that you have begun applying to US institutions.

- 11. Select 'yes' or 'no' to indicate if you have applied, or intend to apply, to a U.S. institution.
- 12. Select the number of U.S. institutions to which you have applied from the drop down menu:
 - a. Enter name of institution
 - b. Enter specific name of department
 - c. Select the date you applied for the institution (Month-Day-Year format)
 - d. Enter the term you applied for
 - e. Enter year you applied for
 - f. Select the result of your application from the drop down menu
 - g. Select 'yes' or 'no' to indicate if you are still interested in pursuing this program

Authorization of Release of Information

Additional Information

Required Additional Documentation

1. Country specific materials

All New Zealand applicants are required to complete and upload the Fulbright NZ Country Specific Questions form. Download the form from the 'Country Information' section of the application, under the heading 'Supplemental Forms'. This form is required – your application is not complete without this form.

2. Supplemental materials

Applicants for the Ngā Pae o te Māramatanga award must also include in their application an award-specific essay/statement. Your statement should not exceed one A4 page, typed, font size 11. Upload your award-specific statement in this section. This document is required for Ngā Pae o te Māramatanga applicants — your application is not complete without this form.

Do not upload any additional documents other than the country specific questions form and the award-specific statement (if required) as outlined above. Any non-required documents submitted will not be accepted or reviewed by the selection committee.

Recommendations
